



## **Susan Pace Hamill Raises Over \$120,000 for State House District 63 Campaign**

Tuscaloosa, AL - Susan Pace Hamill, who is seeking the Democratic nomination for Alabama House District 63, reported today that her campaign has raised over \$120,000. Hamill's financial disclosure reports also show that none of the money she has raised has come from special interest groups in Montgomery.

Said Hamill, " Every cent of that money has come from personal relationships. My contributors are people who believe in what I stand for - a fairer tax system that is based on biblical principles."

Tuscaloosa Political Consultant Joe Perkins says he expects Hamill has outraised almost all other state house candidates, including incumbents. "For Susan to come into this race as a first time candidate and raise this kind of money is truly phenomenal.

Hamill has been a law professor at the University of Alabama since 1994. In 2002, Hamill earned her Master's degree in Theological Studies from Beeson Divinity School at Samford University. Since that time, Hamill has focused her efforts on advocating fairer tax policies that are rooted in biblical principles. In a speech last July announcing her candidacy, Hamill stated that she decided seek public office after concluding that it would be "disingenuous to tell others they need to change things if you are not willing to roll up your sleeves and help make the changes happen."
